How long have you been in the Defence industry?

I have been in the industry for 40 years, mainly defence and now recently aerospace with Ultra.

They need to appreciate that the work is not all nice clean and rosy. A lot of defence equipment is dated and even the "newer" kit is still around 3-5 years old and probably dated as the development can take a number of years plus support requirements can be up to 25-30 years
